Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back! We hope you have all had a great half term and have made some lovely memories! This is the final term of the year and it is a busy one!



English

In this Summer term, we will be linking our English work to the History topic of Vikings. We will be using our knowledge and learning from both History and English to write a newspaper recount as well as our own narrative text which links to the book we will be reading in class called 'Viking Boy'. On top of this, we will continue developing our Grammar knowledge while exploring commas, prefixes and much more!

Maths

We will begin the term looking at algebra and equations before looking at shapes and their area, perimeter and volume. Then to finish off Summer 1 we will be looking closely at time and how to read the time as well as bus timetables! In Summer 2 we will then begin to look at data handling and measuring and interpreting angles before exploring shape again. We will focus on the properties of shapes, as well as translating and reflecting these accurately.



Reading

Please continue to read 5 times a week at home with your child—practicing at home has so many benefits! Please make sure you sign the planners as we check every week.

What we are learning in the wider curriculum

RSHE: In the Summer term we will be learning about safety in the changing body and transition which will link closely to our learning in Science. Look out in Summer 2 as we will be sending information home regarding what will be discussed in our learning.

RE: In Summer 1, we will be investigating different religions around the world. Then, in Summer 2, we will explore how people express their faith through the arts. We will use our learning to create our own faith-inspired art pieces.

Art/DT: In the Summer term, we will be learning about Claude Monet and his style of watercolour painting. Then we will also be making our own Viking bread, linking to the History topic and using a traditional Viking recipe.

PE: In Summer 1, we will begin with orienteering and dance before then moving onto golf and rounders in the Summer 2 term.

Science: This term we will be learning about lifecycles and reproduction in Summer 1, linking to what we have been learning in Science in the Spring term about animal classifications. We will then move onto learning about the changes that occur as humans grow and develop.

History/Geography: In the Summer, we will continue our learning around Climate Change while also exploring the topic of the Vikings, linking this to both our English as well as the Viking bread that we will be making.

Computing: Throughout the Summer we will be exploring concept maps in Summer 1 before moving onto learning about skills required to create and edit spreadsheets.
