### Key vocabulary

- **Commandments** - Rules that God had made to tell people how they should live.
- **Dilemma** - A difficult situation in which you have to choose between two or more alternatives.
- **Freedom**- The power or right to act, speak and change as one wants without hindrance or restraint.
- **Justice**- A concept of moral rightness based on ethics, rationality, law, religion or equity.
- **Moral** - The standards of good or bad behaviour, fairness, honesty, etc. that each person believes in.

##### **Show an understanding of:-**

- Key features of the New Testament using a widening religious vocabulary eg the names and content of the 4 parts.
- People in the New Testament eg Jesus, Peter, Saul (Paul) and aspects of their lives/ teaching as an inspiration.
- The use of Jesus' teaching as a source of inspiration in today's world.

##### **Questions - express own ideas thoughtfully:-**

- Raise and suggest answers to questions about the New Testament.

##### **Apply ideas about:**

- Jesus' teachings as a source of inspiration, eg Good Samaritan, to their own ideas and experiences.

Teachings about issues of forgiveness, apologising, and valuing others from Jesus' teachings to their own ideas and experiences.

- You have learnt about people in the Old Testament eg Moses, Ruth, and aspects of their lives/ teaching as an inspiration.
- You have learnt about inspirational people from Jewish and Christian stories - Daniel (the lion's den, his friends in the fiery furnace), and Moses.
