Key vocabulary

- **Shahadah** - In order to become a Muslim, a person must complete the first pillar of Islam called Shahada. They make a statement that they believe in one God called Allah.
- **Salat** - A prayer that all Muslims perform.
- **Zakah** - This pillar is about looking after the other people. Each Muslim gives up a share of their wealth each year to provide for those less fortunate. The word Zakat means to purify and cleanse.
- **Sawm** - An Arabic term used to describe the art of fasting.
- **Hajj** - In Islam, the hajj is the pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca in Saudi Arabia which every adult Muslim must make at least once in their lifetime.
