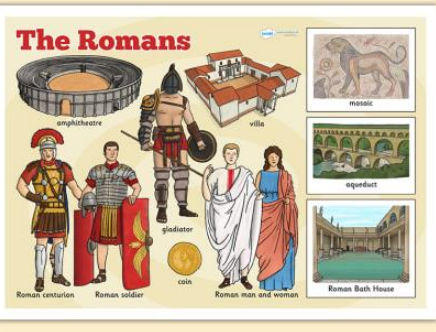

The Romans

Key vocabulary

- Emperor - a sovereign ruler of an empire.
- empire - an extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch, an oligarchy, or a sovereign state.
- soldier - a person who serves in an army.
- Invade - an army force entry to occupy land.
- dictator - a ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained control by force.



Sticky knowledge

Julius Caesar was probably the best known Roman leader. He extended the empire by invading other lands.

The Romans invaded Britain in 43AD and ruled for around 400 years.

When the Romans came to Britain they created straight roads, a written language, coins, laws and a legal system.

The Romans were preceded by The Celts and were succeeded by the Anglo Saxons.

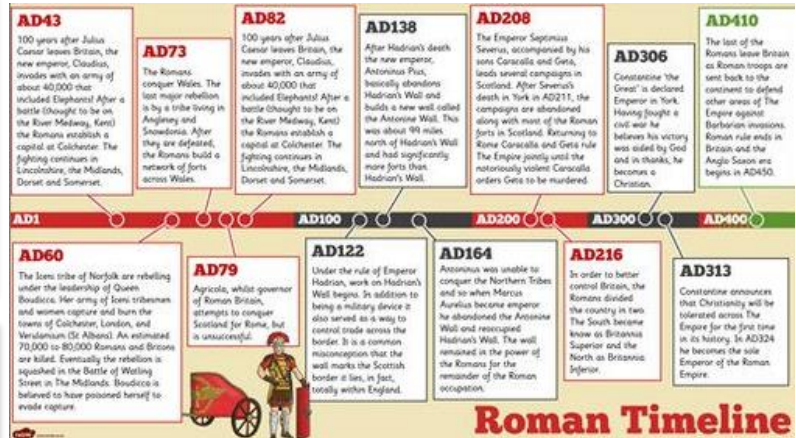
