Key vocabulary

- **Commandments** - Rules that God had made to tell people how they should live.
- **Dilemma** - A difficult situation in which you have to choose between two or more alternatives.
- **Freedom**- The power or right to act, speak and change as one wants without hindrance or restraint.
- **Justice**- A concept of moral rightness based on ethics, rationality, law, religion or equity.
- **Moral** - The standards of good or bad behaviour, fairness, honesty, etc. that each person believes in.

- Key features of the New Testament eg the 4 parts, etc.
- People in the New Testament eg Jesus, Peter, Saul (Paul) and aspects of their lives/ teaching as an inspiration

- Ask questions about the New Testament

Make links between:

- What inspires the pupils and Jesus' teaching as a source of inspiration. Their issues of forgiveness, apologising, valuing others to the Jesus' teachings about these.

Links to previous learning

- You have learnt about people in the Old Testament eg Moses, Ruth, and aspects of their lives/ teaching as an inspiration.
- You have learnt about inspirational people from Jewish and Christian stories - Daniel (the lion's den, his friends in the fiery furnace), and Moses.
- You have practiced skills expressing ideas about values from the stories.
