World War 2 - a global conflict that lasted from 1939 to 1945

Hitler - Adolf Hitler (20 April 1889 - 30 April 1945) was an Austrian-born German politician who was the dictator of Germany from 1933 until he died in 1945.

Evacuated - remove (someone) from a place of danger to a safer place.

Luftwaffe - the name for the air force of Germany.

RAF - Royal Air Force - The air force of the UK

Seaborne Invasion - an invasion on or over the sea

Invasion - an instance of **invading** a country or region with an armed force

Blitz - an intensive or sudden military attack

Propaganda - information, especially of a **biased** or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view.

Retaliated - make an attack in return for a similar attack

Allies - a country that supports and helps another country in a war;
