

In DT we are learning about... **Textiles - Can you make a simple glove puppet to tell a story to your parent or carer?**

Key vocabulary

Appliqué - to attach a decorative fabric item onto another piece of fabric by gluing and/or sewing.

Design - to generate, develop and communicate ideas for a product.

Evaluate - to judge how a product meets chosen criteria.

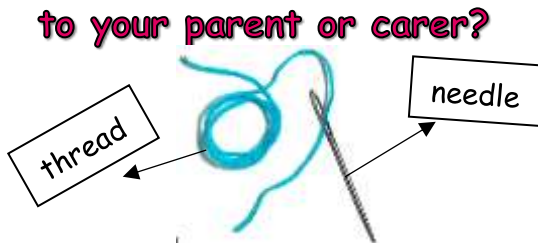
Fray - to unravel or become worn at the edge.

Glove puppet - a glove puppet fits over the hand, and the fingers operate its head and arms.

Seam - a row of stitches joining two pieces of fabric.

Sew - to join pieces of fabric with stitches using a needle and thread.

Template - a shape drawn to assist in cutting out shapes.

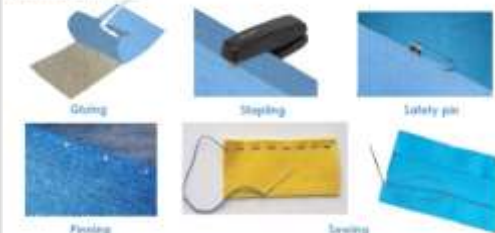

Sticky knowledge

- Textiles are materials woven from fibres.
- Textiles are used to make clothing, sheets, towels, carpets, rugs and toys such as glove puppets because they are soft and flexible.
- Lots of materials are textiles for example wool, silk, cotton, nylon, felt and polyester.
- Most textiles are made in huge factories but some still make things by hand.
- Stapling and safety pins are quicker ways of joining materials but sewing and gluing are more secure and are easier to hide.
- A needle can be sharp so you need to be careful and safe so you don't hurt your fingers.
