Hot and Cold Places

Key vocabulary

Equator - The imaginary line separating the northern and southern hemispheres.

North Pole- Northern hemisphere where the Earth's axis of rotation meets the surface

South Pole- Southern hemisphere where the Earth's axis of rotation meets the surface.

Ocean- A large body of water which covers a large area of the earth

Continents- A large area of land on earth that is joined together.

There are 7 continents Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, North America, Australia and South Africa.

Deserts - regions characterised by three main features - low rainfall, little vegetation and extreme temperatures.

Polar Region - area around the North Pole or the South Pole.
