Key vocabulary

- **Body**-the physical structure, including the bones, flesh, and organs, of a person or an animal.
- **Senses**- The body's tools that allow us to gather information about the world around us. They include sight, hearing, taste, touch, and smell.
- **Sight/see**- The sense that lets us see the world around us using our eyes.
- **Hearing/hear**- The sense that lets us listen to sounds using our ears.
- **Touch/feel**- The sensation of physical contact through our skin.
- **Taste**- This comes from your tongue and is the flavour of something.
- **Smell**- Smelling odours or scents by using the nose.
- **Body parts**- including, head, neck, arms, elbows, legs, knees, face, ears, eyes, hair, mouth and teeth.

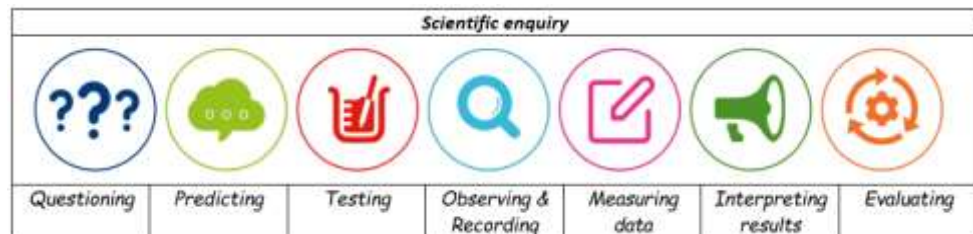
