Key vocabulary

Instruments:

digital/electronic sounds, turntables, synthesisers, drums

Vocabulary:

- Lyrics-the words of a song
- Choreography-the arrangement of sounds
- Unison-everyone sings or plays at the same time
- Texture-the layers of sounds in a piece of music
- Structure-how the different parts of the music are put together
- Hook-the catchy part of a song that we remember and sing
- Riff-a short repeated phrase often played on a main instrument
- Melody-another name for tune
- Solo -an Italian name for singing or playing alone
- Pulse-the steady beat in a piece of music
- Rhythm-short and longer sounds that are put together
- Pitch- How high or low a sound is
- Improvise- to make up a tune and play it on the spot
- Compose- to create and develop musical ideas and 'fix' them
- Perform-singing and playing instruments for others to hear
- Audience-the people listening and watching
- Melody-another name for tune
- Dynamics-How quietly or loudly music is played
- Tempo-how fast or slow the music is played

Musical Style: Rap

- Finding the pulse- is when you can tap or clap to the steady beat
- Rap music is a fast, rhythmic style where words are often rhyming.
- Instruments can make different pitched sounds by playing different notes
- Improvise- When a simple melody is made up and played on a musical instrument
- Choreograph your performance so that there is movement and music to entertain the audience
