Egyptian Death Masks - Sculpture

Key Vocabulary



- **Ancient Egyptians** - A group of people living in Egypt from 3000 BC until 30 BC when they were invaded by the Romans.
- **Mummy** - A dead human (or animal) that has been preserved using chemicals or low temperatures so that it does not decay.
- **Sculpture** - 3D piece art often carved or chiselled from stone.
- **Medium** - Materials used to make a work of art.
- **Emboss** - Create a raised surface that sticks out from the page.
- **Embellishment** - Adding decorative features and details.
- **Modroc** - Gauze material covered with quick-drying plaster.



Sticky Knowledge



- These were masks to look like the dead person to help their soul return to their body to rest.
- It also allowed the Ancient Egyptian god of death (Anubis) to lead the person to the afterlife.
- Royalty (and rich Egyptians) had masks made of gold or silver, whereas poorer people had clay or wood masks.
- The mask also guarded the dead body from evil spirits.

Links to Previous Learning
